Method of Judging

(in-hand classes)

20 points system with half-points

Type, head and neck, body and topline, legs, and movement will each be awarded points from 1-20 by each of five judges. The total of points will be divided by the number of judges to give a score out of 100 for the horse. In the event of a tie for 1st to 10th place, the higher place will be given to the horse with the most points for type. If there is still a tie the higher place will be given to the horse with the most points for movement. Failing a decision on either of these, one judge chosen by ballot will name his preference. 1st and 2nd places horses of each class qualify for their respective championships.

In-hand Championship

Horses placed first and second in each class qualify for the appropriate championship. A junior Gold champion ,junior Silver champion and junior Bronze Champion both male and female will be chosen from classes 4,6,8 and respectively 3,5,7

A senior Gold champion ,senior Silver champion and senior Bronze Champion male and female, will be chosen from classes 9 to 11 and 12 to 14.

a) The better 50 % of each class minus one, but not more than 5 horses, qualify
example: 5-6 starters places 1 - 2 qualify

7-8 starters places 1 - 3 qualify

9-10 starters places 1 - 4 qualify

11 and more starters places 1 - 5 qualify

b) All qualified horses of each category (Junior Males, Junior Females, Senior Males, Senior Females) come into the ring. All first placed horses are standing in the front row, all second placed horses in the second row, all other horses (places 3-5) in the third row.

c) The judges select their Gold Champion from the first row ,and Silver and Bronze Champion from all the rest. They then select another

Where the year only is given for date of birth, horses will be deemed to have been born on 1st January. Passports for horses registered in Europe (or registration Certificate for horses from outside Europe) with graphic description to be presented at the show.

Starting Order	<p>The show organisers will decide the classes. The starting order will be decided by lot (and NOT in the order in which entries are received). Exhibit number sheets for the in-hand classes and liberty which are to be returned, will be obtained at the secretary at the showground on payment of 12,50 € deposit.</p>										
Dress	<p>Handlers in in-hand classes are requested to wear predominantly white clothing. In-hand horses must be shown in normally accepted show bridles or headcollars which are of sufficient strength to ensure the exhibits do not get loose in the ring. Colts and stallions ages 3 years and over must be bitted. The penalty for owners of horses which get loose in the ring will be an immediate fine of 75 € for each offence and the horse will be shown last in his class.</p>										
Protests	<p>Protests will be handled in accordance with ECAHO Rules except that no deposit need be lodged in the event of an alleged incorrect calculation of results.</p>										
Vaccination against influenza	<p>All horses have to have their vaccination certificates endorsed by a veterinary officer. Horses need 2 or 3 primary vaccinations against influenza not less than 21 days and no more than 92 days apart. Vaccination regulations will follow those of the FEI.(6months interval) NO HORSE WILL BE ACCEPTED IF IT HAS RECEIVED AN INJECTION OF INFLUENZA VACCINE WITHIN THE TEN DAYS PREVIOUS TO THE SHOW. HORSES WITHOUT A VALID VACCINATION CERTIFICATE WILL NOT BE ALLOWED TO COMPETE. Original documents have to be presented on demand</p>										
Showers	<p>Showers for grooms will be available on the showgrounds.</p>										
Doctor, vet and blacksmith	<p>A doctor, a vet and a farrier will be available throughout the show. Costs are to be covered by the exhibitor.</p>										
Costs	<p>The organisers, accept no liability for exhibitors' costs.</p>										
Liability disclaimer	<p>The organisers shall not be liable for death, injury, disease or damage to any person, horse or property howsoever caused. Show Rules of Conduct & Procedures

1) ADHERENCE TO WAHC RULES OF CONDUCT - Organizing committee members, show officials, judges, trainers, exhibitors and handlers will unconditionally submit themselves and their accompanying persons to the 'Show Rules of Conduct and Procedures' and will accept the jurisdiction of the World Arabian Horse Community. Regarding veterinary matters, drug administration, and the misuse of banned substances, all show organizing committee members, show officials, judges, trainers, exhibitors and handlers will unconditionally submit themselves and their accompanying persons to the jurisdiction of the International Equestrian Federation (FEI) and all the veterinary regulations upheld by the FEI. The WAHC shall not be liable for any consequence of any decision made by show organizing committee members, show officials, judges, trainers, exhibitors and handlers in conjunction with an WAHC affiliated event. These Rules will be interpreted by such committees where necessary according to the customs and laws specific to each country in which a WAHC affiliated is conducted. Show organizers are not permitted to introduce rules which are in conflict with the WAHC "Show Rules of Conduct and Procedures".

2) ADMINISTRATION OF CHEMICAL IRRITANTS/GINGER - Any trainer, owner, agent or other person who administers, attempts to administer, instructs, aids, conspires with another to administer, or employs anyone who administers or attempts to administer a chemical or other irritant of any kind onto the anus, vulva, rectal area or vaginal area of a horse entered to compete in a class for Arabian horses at any World Arabian Horse Community (WAHC) affiliated event shall be subject to penalties as provided for in section (e) below.

- (a) Competition management is authorized, at its own expense, to collect swab samples and have tested substances present on the anus, vulva, rectal area or vaginal area of horses prior to their entry and/or following their exit from the ring, in connection any Arabian class any WAHC affiliated event as follows:
- 1) competition management may choose all horses in such a class to be sampled, or may select one or more placings from the class for sampling, or may select some of the horses from such a class for sampling. In making such selections, competition management may act on the request of a judge of the class but is not required to do so;
 - 2) competition management shall appoint only a licensed veterinarian or veterinarians to supervise the sampling, who may utilize technicians working under direct supervision of the veterinarian(s);
 - 3) competition management shall implement the chain of custody required by the laboratory for identifying the horse from which each sample was taken;
 - 4) competition management is authorized to forward the samples for testing to a reputable laboratory acceptable to WAHC, and shall implement the chain of custody required by the laboratory for transporting the samples to and from the laboratory and while at the laboratory.
- (b) The trainer, owner, and their agents of a horse competing in a class must submit to the above sample collections performed by representatives of competition management, and they must do so with no unnecessary delays. They must cooperate with the sample collection personnel as defined above exhibiting polite attitude and actions toward them and must assist them by helping to restrain the horse properly during the sample collection(s);
- (c) In the event the laboratory reports to the competition management the presence of a chemical or other irritant of any kind in a horse's sample, competition management shall forward to WAHC the original copies of the laboratory report, the analytical data, and the documented chain of custody for identifying the horse from which the sample was collected and identifying the laboratory results as being from that horse's sample.
- (d) Upon receipt of the above documents, WAHC shall review those documents, relevant competition and WAHC records, and shall determine whether this evidence serves as a basis for charges of rule violation against the horse's trainer, owner, and/or their agents;
- (e) In the event the WAHC determines a violation has occurred, the trainer, owner and/or their agents each shall be subject to any and all penalties imposed by the WAHC Standards & Ethics Committee at its discretion, including suspensions, fines, and the revocation and redistribution of winnings, notice or notices of which shall be published on the WAHC website. The suggested minimum penalty for a first offense is the revocation of all the horse's winnings in connection with the entire competition in question, and a suspension of 60 days with a fine of €1000. Subsequent violations of this Article by any of the above individuals/entities shall be subject to such greater penalties as determined at the discretion of the Disciplinary Committee.

3) AGE OF HORSES - To facilitate the division of entries into classes according to age, all horses shall be considered to be one (1) year older on the first day of January following the actual date of foaling (birth date).

4) CONFLICT OF INTEREST - An actual or apparent Conflict of Interest is explicitly defined as any of the following:

- a) a horse is judged that has been bought or sold by the judge either as owner or agent;
- b) a horse is judged that is owned in whole or part by the judge or by a member of the judge's family, or business partner in an Arabian horse business venture;
- c) a horse is judged that has been leased by the judge, at any time;
- d) a horse is judged that has been bred by the judge or is the property of a breeding organization in which the judge is or was an employee;
- e) a horse is judged that has been regularly trained, examined or treated by the judge in a professional capacity;
- f) a horse is judged that is the subject of an on-going negotiation to buy or lease, or a provisional purchase condition to which the judge is a party;
- g) a Judge SHALL NOT be allowed to adjudicate any entries owned by, presented by, campaigned by and/or showing under the name of an Exhibitor (BREEDER, OWNER, TRAINER, AGENT, LESSOR/LEASEE, TRAINING CENTER and/or STUD FARM) to/for whom the Judge has sold horses as AGENT, OWNER, BREEDER, LESSOR and/or LEASEE within the six (6) month period prior to the commencement of the WAHC Event at which the Judge will officiating. It is the responsibility of the Judge to advise the Show Organizer and the Disciplinary Committee if such a conflict arises. Any Judge that fails to disclose any such Conflict of Interest, shall be suspended from officiating any WAHC show or event in ANY capacity for a period of six (6) months from the date of infraction.
- h) a Judge SHALL NOT be allowed to adjudicate any entries owned by, presented by, campaigned by and/or showing under the name of an Exhibitor (BREEDER, OWNER, TRAINER, AGENT, LESSOR/LEASEE, TRAINING CENTER and/or STUD FARM) with which the Judge is knowingly involved in a profit-oriented business relationship of any kind. The Judge shall furthermore be prohibited from adjudicating any entries by any such Exhibitor for a period of six (6) months following the formal termination of the business relationship. Any Judge that fails to disclose any such Conflict of Interest, shall be suspended from officiating any WAHC show or event in ANY capacity for a period of six (6) months from the date of infraction

The decision of the Disciplinary Committee shall be final should any doubt exist concerning any apparent Conflict of Interest.

Exhibitors MUST declare on all show entry forms any actual or apparent Conflict of Interest with any of the official Judges hired to adjudicate the event in question.

Show Organizers MAY NOT accept any entries for which any actual or apparent Conflict of Interest exists, unless a Reserve Judge is available to adjudicate on behalf of the Judge with whom the Conflict of Interest exists.

5) DISCIPLINE - Exhibitors are warned that any act of discourtesy or disobedience to the officials on the part of the owner, trainer, handler, groom, rider, member of the family or any such persons associated with those participating in the show, will disqualify the horse from adjudication. The management reserves to itself the right to remove a trainer, handler, owner, groom, horse, rider or associated persons from the show without being liable for compensation or damages. Excessive use of the whip on any horse in a stall, runway, schooling area, show ring or elsewhere on the competition grounds before or during a show, by any person, constitutes a violation and renders the offender subject to penalty. Judges will be expected to enforce this in the Show Ring. Any action(s) against a horse by an Exhibitor, which are deemed excessive by a Judge, DC Member, Ring Steward, Veterinarian or the Show Committee anywhere on the grounds may be punished by elimination from the show. It is a violation of WAHC Rules to commit any act or make remarks during the show that are considered offensive or made with intent to influence or cast aspersions on the judging, and any Exhibitor may be barred from the show for this offense by the Show Committee.

6) DISGUISED OF EXHIBITS

- a) No alteration of the basic color of the skin, coat or hooves is permitted. Hoof paints, colourless varnishes, coat dyes, glitter spray and cosmetic operations including skin grafts are forbidden. Colorless hoof oils, Vaseline, oil and white chalk used on white legs is permitted.
- b) Artificial methods of dilating the eyes of affecting the natural action of the horse or otherwise influencing its action or behavior by oxygenating the bloodstream, by the use of weights or artificially weighted shoes, or by electrical or chemical treatment of any kind at any time before or during exhibition are forbidden. Burns, cuts or other marks on the body of any exhibit in such places or positions as indicate prohibited methods have been used, will be regarded by the DC with veterinary advice as full and adequate grounds for exclusion of any exhibit from competition.
- c) In halter classes horses may be fully or partly body clipped subject to eyelashes and hair inside the ears left unshaven, as well as muzzle, nose and eye tactile hair being intact. **Balding around the eyes, nose and muzzle is NOT encouraged. Judges should not unduly penalize horses that exhibit balding around the eyes, nose and muzzle.**
- d) No equipment intended to alter the natural appearance of the horse is permitted in the stables, including neck sweats, neck collars, tailracks, hobbles or weights. Clippers are acceptable. Exhibitors using such equipment on the showground will be suspended by the DC for the period of the show.

6) DISPUTE NOT COVERED BY RULES - Should any question or dispute arise not provided for in the governing rules, the same shall be referred to the Show Committee, whose decision will be final.

7) DRUGS & MEDICATIONS - The drugs and medication rules currently upheld in accordance with the most recent FEI Veterinary Regulations will be enforced. Horses in competition will be subject to examination by the attending licensed veterinarian under the supervision of the Disciplinary Committee (DC) appointed at each WAHC sanctioned event. The examination may include physical, saliva, urine, blood tests, the testing of eyes for the use of mydriatic drugs or any other test or procedure at the discretion of said DC necessary to effectuate the purposes of this rule. These representatives must be treated with respect. Any exhibit may be tested at the request of any judge or DC. Regu-Mate® (alfrenogest) may be administered to mares without penalty. Refusal to submit a horse for examination, whether in competition or not, and to cooperate with the veterinarian and technicians until the samples have been taken, constitutes a violation of entry and subjects the horse to disqualification under the rules. Moreover, should the attending veterinarian designated to collect physiological specimens from any horse for the purpose of drug testing deem the collection procedure may endanger the horse or the person(s) attending the horse, the DCs will be notified and proceed with disqualification of that entry. In both cases, the disqualified horse will be ineligible to receive any awards, titles and prize money or to compete further at the event in which the infraction occurred. Disqualification cases will be forwarded to the WAHC Standards & Ethics Committee by the attending DC.

8) DRUGS & MEDICATIONS MISUSE - The intentional or unintentional administration of any substance considered prohibited in accordance with FEI Veterinary Regulations which may affect the performance, soundness or temperament of any exhibit is strictly prohibited at all WAHC affiliated events. An up-to-date copy of the FEI Veterinary Regulations listing all forbidden substances will be maintained by each Show Organizer. All procedures related to Drug & Medication misuse will be subject to FEI Veterinary Regulations, unless otherwise stated. Should a positive result of forbidden substance use be acknowledged by the FEI authorized laboratory, the Show Organizer and the WAHC Standards & Ethics Committee will be notified of the infraction. Any forbidden substance positive test result shall be considered incontrovertible evidence that a violation of rules has been committed. This offence will illicit the following official response by the WAHC:

- 1) The owner of the horse will be wholly liable for the infraction unless irrefutable evidence implicating another person can be produced and substantiated
- 2) All persons involved in administration of and/or approval of the use of the forbidden substance shall be fined two thousand euro (€2000) each
- 3) Disqualification of the horse from all WAHC sanctioned events for a period of twelve (12) months. All titles and/or qualification achieved by the horse at the event at which the forbidden substance was used shall be forfeit. The incident, listing the name of disqualified horse, the suspended persons responsible and the forbidden substance used, will be published on the WAHC website.

9) EMERGENCY TREATMENT - Any exhibitor or exhibitor representative may request any veterinarian to treat an entry in an emergency situation. This treatment shall be classified as "Emergency Treatment". The administering veterinarian AND the attending exhibitor MUST sign a certificate stating the reason for the Emergency Treatment, which shall be surrendered to the Disciplinary Committee. Emergency Treatments administered to alleviate lameness, colic, or any other severe injury/ailment are permitted on the showground. The treated horse, however, will be withdrawn from participation in the show. All Emergency Treatments administered on the showground MUST be reported to the Disciplinary Committee and the Show Organizer. Emergency Treatments that may alter the performance of the horse are NOT permissible.

10) ENTRY REFUSAL - The Show Committee reserves the right to refuse, accept conditionally, or cancel any entries of any exhibitor at their discretion. This refusal will be issued in writing by the Show Organizer.

11) FOALS - Classes for Foals may be conducted at any WAHC affiliated event. Classes for Foals may be held for all Show Levels. Foal classes at a WAHC sanctioned event will be under the jurisdiction of WAHC Rules. Foals shown in a Foal Class at a WAHC sanctioned event must be at least sixty (60) days old on the date which they are first shown.

Foals shown in a Foal Class must be shown "at foot" (alongside their dam) from sixty (60) to one-hundred-twenty (120) days of age.

The System of Judging used in Foal Classes may be determined by each show organizer. All Foals must be held during the award (prize giving) ceremony.

Championship classes for Foals are optional. If Championship classes for Foals are organized, it is recommended the Show Organizer award Gold, Silver & Bronze Medals. Foals are NOT eligible to compete in Junior Championships at any WAHC sanctioned event.

Foal classes/championships are not considered eligible to qualify Foals for any WAHC affiliated event of higher hierarchical status.

Foals may be partly/completely body clipped, as defined in DISGUISED OF EXHIBITS, Item c), listed above.

12) IDENTIFICATION OF HORSES - All horses entered in a WAHC event must possess an official equine passport, or a photocopy of the original registration document with graphic description, to facilitate identity verification of the horse by the organizing committee and disciplinary committee.

No announcement indicating the identity, breeding or past performance of any exhibits, or the identity of the owners of the exhibits may be made at any time prior to or during the judging of an entry. The name, age, breeding, breedership and ownership of the entry may be publicly announced after the scores for that entry have been officially announced and/or posted.

13) IDENTIFICATION NUMBERS - Every horse entered in the show will be assigned an identification number (entry number) that MUST be worn by each horse handler (Exhibitor) when showing in a class.

14) INDEMNITY AND NON-RESPONSIBILITY - All entries are accepted with the understanding that the World Arabian Horse Community will not be held responsible for any loss, damage or injury to any horse exhibited or any article of any kind. All horses shall be under the control and direction of the Show Committee but solely at the risk of the Exhibitor, who will be responsible for any loss, damage or injury to any person, animals or property occasioned by him, his agents or employees, or by any animal owned or exhibited by him, and shall indemnify the World Arabian Horse Community against any and all loss, damages and liability thus occasioned, including, but not limited to, any and all legal costs, including attorney fees, which may be incurred as a result thereof. Exhibitors, grooms, handlers, owners, etc. are hereby warned that they may not use any device or conduct which may cause harm to any other person(s) horses, or equipment. **THE SUBMISSION OF A SIGNED ENTRY FORM TO THE SECRETARY SHALL CONSTITUTE AN ACCEPTANCE BY EACH PERSON OF THE PROVISIONS HEREIN SET FORTH.**

15) PROTEST - Any Show Organizer, appointed Judge, Ring Master, Exhibitor or Owner of a horse entered at the show may file a protest alleging violation of WAHC rules. All protests MUST BE made in writing prior to the end of the show and presented to the Disciplinary Committee or sent to the WAHC Executive Secretary within five (5) working days following the conclusion of the show. The DC is responsible to present a copy of the protest to the Show Organizer and to notify the "World Arabian Horse Community" and the WAHC Standards & Ethics Committee.

16) REGISTRATION REQUIREMENTS

- 1) A valid registration certificate or official correspondence from the governing National Registry indicating the completion of registration prior to the start of the WAHC affiliated show must accompany the entry form for all show entries
- 2) "Registration Date" shall be defined as the date on which the appropriate WAHO-recognized registering authority for Arabian horses determines the horse (show entry) fully accepted for registration into the studbook of that country.
- 3) WAHO-recognized registering authorities for Arabian horses within in each member country will have sole responsibility to determine Registration Date.

17) RING PROCEDURES - Any exhibitor using the wrong number or having no number may be excused or disqualified from the class at the discretion of the Show Organizer. No person other than the officials, Ring Steward, attendants on duty, and the Judge of the class may enter the show ring without permission from the Show Organizer.

18) SCHEDULE - Management reserves the right to change the arena location of classes with the prior notification to exhibitors.

Show Management reserves the right to split classes with greater than fifteen (15) entries. Show Management reserves the right to combine classes with adjacent age groups of the same sex with fewer than three (3) entries. Show Management reserves the right to change the dates and/or the location of the Show or to cancel the Show altogether. In the event of a cancellation, all entry fees and stall fees will be refunded (office fees are non-refundable). Neither the Show Management nor the World Arabian Horse Community shall have any liability to any exhibitor, owner, handler or other person, firm or corporation by reason of any change or cancellation of the show, except for the return of fees as aforesaid.

19) SOUNDNESS - Horses must be serviceably sound i.e., horse must not show evidence of lameness. Horses which appear to be lame, with clear evidence of pain, may NOT be assessed and placed by the judges. Judges must excuse from the ring any horse so lame that assessment will inflict pain. All entries must be in good condition.

20) STRESS - Horses shall not be punished unnecessarily or severely anywhere on the show grounds. Excessive whipping or shanking, excessive stimulation by noise or intimidation, use of electrical shock devices or infliction of pain by any means is forbidden in all parts of the showground, or stable areas, at all times.

Undue stress, inflicted upon horses by handlers anywhere & anytime on the show grounds, is subject to the issuance of Yellow & Red Cards from the DC. This undue stress is defined as:

- 1) Whipping or shanking of horses standing still
- 2) Horse crouching or squatting when standing
- 3) Horse falling to its knees after presentation of the whip
- 4) Horse running or bolting backwards three (3) or more steps
- 5) A strike by the horse with the forelegs with ears pinned back
- 6) An aggressive attempt by the horse to bite

DCs are authorized to patrol the show grounds to ensure equine stress is minimized. All abuse and cruelty will be dealt with under WAHC rules. All horses artificially, improperly or unfairly prepared or tampered with before coming into the Show Ring will be disqualified. If it is ascertained that an Exhibitor has made, or caused to be made, any false statements in regards to any animal or article exhibited or if any Exhibitor shall attempt to interfere with the Judge in performance of his/her duties, they shall be excluded from competing or exhibiting.

21) VACCINATIONS - Vaccinations for all entries must be up to date and indicated on the entry form. Twelve (12) month vaccination intervals shall be considered standard, unless otherwise mandated by local/national authorities.

22) VETERINARIAN INSPECTION - At the discretion of the DC Veterinarian, all Horses with any apparent clinical signs of any disease are not allowed to participate at a WAHC sanctioned event. Should the DC Veterinarian diagnose apparent clinical signs of contagious disease, all subject horses will be immediately confined to quarantine and will not be allowed to participate in the show. All entry and stabling fees as well as prize monies earned will be forfeit.

23) WARNINGS: VERBAL, YELLOW & RED CARDS

Verbal Warnings: Disciplinary Committee Members, Ring Stewards and/or Show Officials have the right to issue verbal warnings to handlers concerning behaviour towards and/or treatment to horses and/or people anytime during the show anywhere on the show grounds. Verbal Warnings shall not be recorded in the official show report submitted by the DC.

Should Verbal Warnings be ignored, further action may be instituted against horse handlers exclusively according to the following protocol:

- a) **Yellow Card:** This card shall be issued after a Verbal Warning, should the initial Verbal Warning be ignored or a further offence committed. A Yellow Card may also be issued without a Verbal Warning should the offence be serious in nature, with potential endangerment to horses and people.
- b) **Red Card:** This card shall be issued after a Yellow Card has been issued, provided the Yellow Card has been ignored or a further offence committed. Should an offence involving serious mistreatment and/or reckless endangerment of horses and/or people occur, a Red Card may be issued without a prior Verbal Warning or Yellow Card. Any handler who is issued a Red Card will be suspended from exhibiting any horses for the duration of the event at which the Red Card was issued. A replacement handler must replace the suspended handler for the duration of the class in which the Red Card was issued.

Yellow & Red Cards may be issued by all Disciplinary Committee Members and/or Ring Stewards in either the Show Ring or the Collecting Ring. Both cards are intended to be an explicit

public warning that a serious offence has been committed. Yellow & Red Cards may be issued to handlers of horses ONLY. The nature of the offence, the date on which the offence occurred and the handler responsible for the offence for all issued Yellow & Red Cards must be recorded by the DC in the official show report and publicly announced during the show. The WAHC will publish the names of all handlers that receive Yellow and Red Cards on the official WAHC website.

Should any handler be issued three (3) Yellow Cards during any calendar year (from January 1st to December 31st), that handler shall be fined a penalty of five hundred euro (€500,-), payable to the WAHC. Should any handler be issued two (2) Red Cards or five (5) Yellow Cards during any calendar year (from January 1st to December 31st), that handler shall be fined a penalty of two thousand euro (€2000,-), payable to the WAHC. Any handler receiving more than three (3) Red Cards in any calendar year will be suspended from participating in all WAHC affiliated events for the remainder of that calendar year as well as the entire calendar year (from January 1st to December 31st) following the infraction.

ELRAN FOAL EVENT 2011 + LIBERTY EVENT

Foal classes are not recognized by EAHSC.

Foals must have a minimum age of one month at the date of the show

The use of metal halters and halters with chains is forbidden.

The foals shall be held in hand for the prize giving ceremony.

Conditions of Entry

Liberty Classes

Liberty classes are open for mares and stallions born in 2010 and before.

Horses that take part in liberty classes can NOT take part in the in-hand classes.

The horses are presented in the ring by the handler and one assistant, shown firstly to the judges and then in liberty for ninety seconds to the music of the owners choice. When the music stops, the horse must be caught within sixty seconds.

Classes :

1. Fillies born in 2011
2. Colts born in 2011
3. Liberty

(Liberty classes) Points will be given from 1-20 for type, conformation and movement.
There will be no championship for Liberty Classes and 1st and 2nd place does NOT qualify for championship of in-hand classes.
